Who?

- Primary target audience: 12-34 year-olds (segmented) who are unvaccinated
- Secondary target audience: Adults who are unvaccinated (segmented parents & grandparents, siblings, school community, broader community)

What?

Integrated health services brought to you – HIV, HPV, HTN, diabetes (UPS)

Why?

- Many barriers to access. Mobile outreach reduces the opportunity costs easier access, close and convenient
- Misinformation and disinformation are a serious threat to the health of our communities. We reach youth and communities through our network of youth HCWs on various communication platforms to make accurate information available on demand



Informal settlement and backvards



What do our teams do?

Counselling & Education

- Engagements at individual and community level (schools in particular)
 - Covering: Covid-19, HIV, Sexual & Reproductive Health and family planning, TB, substance abuse and healthy lifestyle to improve overall health literacy

Screening, testing and linkage to care services

- Screening and testing for: Covid-19, HIV, TB, STIs, Diabetes, hypertension, pregnancy testing and mental health
- First 1000 days of life services and children under five: Nutrition and growth monitoring, immunization, deworming, Vit. A supplementation
- Integrated School Health Program (ISHP) Screening - As per ISHP guidelines

Prophylaxis and prevention

- Vaccines: Covid-19, EPI, Human papilloma virus (HPV), Influenza
- Prevention: Condoms, oral contraceptives, injectable contraceptives, emergency contraceptives, PrEP

Treatment

- Syndromic management of sexually transmitted infections (STIs)
- Initiation of ARVs, antihypertensives and diabetes treatment
- CCMDD support
















What are parents saying?

> We had our network of youth mobilisers ask whether parents would vaccinate their child or not

Parents responses:

- COVID is over.
- The vaccine will make my child sick.
- Getting vaccinated does not prevent you from getting COVID so what is the point?
- > I do not see how my child will benefit from getting vaccinated.













Who is at risk?

High risk children include, but is not limited to those with:

- Chronic respiratory conditions
- Chronic heart conditions
- Chronic conditions of the kidney, liver or digestive system
- Chronic neurological diseases
- Endocrine disorders
- Immunosuppression
- Asplenia or dysfunction of the spleen
- Genetic abnormalities














What does vaccination mean for parent & child

- Fewer days away from work for a sick child














What vaccination means for our health system
